## The Way of the Early Church, Part 9: Paul and Silas in Prison

Remember, small groups are primarily for growing closer relationships with other believers. We can learn wonderful things in this environment but keep relationships first.

• Make sure everyone knows each other's names. Have everyone share a little about themselves and how life is going right now.

## - The Way of the Early Church

- o In this series we unlock several powerful eternal principles in order to see God do mighty things!
- This Week: Paul and Silas go to Prison.
- In this situation various people are affected by the power of God. Most in a positive way but some in a negative way. Compare each person or group and note how they were affected.
- Acts 16:12-34
  - o Lydia and her household. She just believed the message and she and her household were saved.
  - o Slave Girl. She was delivered from an evil spirit.
    - Nothing more is said about her. Did she believe? What do you think her future was like?
  - Owners of the Slave Girl.
    - Their business was ruined and they became angry after the encounter with the power of God!
      - What if all of the vice businesses were ruined by the Gospel!!
    - Has the Gospel ever inconvenienced you or made you angry?
      - Does this ever happen inside the church? What are the results of that?
  - o Paul and Silas.
    - Remember how we win from two weeks ago?
      - We, as believers in Jesus, win when we walk by faith, remain faithful and obedient to God, and keep our love of God to the end.
        - o Not necessarily when we live longer more comfortable lives.
        - o Who would you rather be, Paul and Silas or the slave owners?
      - How do you think you would do in their situation?
        - What is the pettiest thing that made you mad at God or the church or another believer?
  - o The Other Prisoners.
    - They were listening. I think they all got saved. They stayed and Paul new they had stayed.
    - They saw the courage and faith of Paul and Silas and were moved.
      - Have you ever been inspired by someone else's struggle and courage?
    - What if Paul and Silas had been bickering with each other and whining to God instead of being courageous and full of faith?
  - o The Jailer.
    - How do prisoners normally feel about their jailer?
    - All of these prisoners were needed to spare this man's life. That is love from God.
      - What if the prisoners had ran? He'd be dead and his family lost.
    - Do not let the devil win by ending your life. Be born again and live for Christ. He will redeem you, give you a purpose, and give you eternal life!
  - o The Jailer's Household.
    - They didn't see any of this, but they believed the testimony. (Like Lydia and her family.)
    - Maybe this is you. You haven't seen it but you can believe just the same! That is good!!
- The power of God affected different people in different ways.
  - o God is always the same. The difference was in who they were and what they wanted.
    - The slave owners wanted to gain money by exploiting people. Others were open to God.
  - o How about you? What type of person are you? How will you respond to God?
  - o Hebrews 10:39 Do not shrink back. You are able to be strong and courageous!
